## LOCATION

**O**l pejeta conservancy has a large area of over 60,000 acres reserved exclusively for 4x4 safari vehicles and this is where our Porini Rhino Camp is located. "There is an airstrip for private charters approximately 10 minutes from camp, and regular scheduled flights arrive at the Nanyuki airstrip which is about 45 minutes drive from the Conservancy."

## THE CAMP

**P**orini Rhino Camp is hidden in a secluded valley and set amongst shady acacia trees on the banks of a seasonal river. The Camp consists of 7 spacious guest tents each comfortably furnished with ensuite bathrooms, flush toilets

and safari showers. The camp is very environmentally friendly with solar powered lighting and no generator. Each tent has been sited to have beautiful views of the surrounding areas.

## THE EXPERIENCE

**T**he combination of amazing wildlife and stunning views across the open plains of Ol Pejeta guarantees an unforgettable safari experience. Game drives are taken in the camp's 4x4 safari vehicles with qualified safari guides. Guided walks are taken on the open plains escorted by maasai warriors. Night drives are also taken to see nocturnal animals. "All the big five have been seen on game drives from the camp."

**P**orini Rhino camp is situated in Ol Pejeta Conservancy a 90,000 acre wildlife conservancy situated within the foothills of Aberdares and the magnificent snowcapped Mount Kenya. Ol Pejeta conservancy boasts an outstanding variety of animals including all the 'Big Five,' the endangered black rhino, the big cats, the rare wild dog species as well as a sanctuary for rescued chimpanzees and also incorporates the smaller Sweetwaters Game Reserve. This combination of amazing wildlife and stunning views across the open plains of Ol Pejeta guarantees an unforgettable safari experience.



## DAILY PROGRAMME

**D**uring your stay, clients will normally have a programme as follows, but of course we're flexible and there to cater to what you'd like:

### DAY1

Fly from Wilson Airport in Nairobi to Nanyuki, arriving at 12:40 where you will be met at the airstrip and transferred to Porini Rhino camp located in the Ol Pejeta Conservancy. Lunch and afternoon tea in camp and then head off to look for rhino with driver-guide in the camps 4x4 safari vehicle. Return to Porini Rhino Camp for dinner and overnight.

### DAY2

Full day in the Ol Pejeta with game drives and walking activities from camp and a night game drive after dinner. Overnight at Porini Rhino Camp.

### DAY3

Early morning bush walk or game drive, breakfast then depart Porini Rhino Camp and transfer to Nanyuki airstrip for the flight back to Nairobi or on to Mara.

## FACILITIES AND ACTIVITIES

- Large Safari tents with a double and single bed , solar lights, en suite bathrooms with flush toilets and safari shower.
- All meals and picnic lunches, free mineral water, sodas, gin and tonic , beer and house wine.
- Custom built 4x4 safari vehicles for game drives.
- Expert driver guides. Morning, evening and night game drives in Ol Pejeta conservancy.
- Escorted walk with Maasai guides
- Sundowner drinks to watch the sunset from scenic viewing points
- Return transfers from Nanyuki Air Strip to Porini Rhino Camp.

## CONSERVATION

**I**n 2004 Ol Pejeta Reserve was purchased by Fauna and Flora international, a U.K based conservation organization. The Sweetwaters Game Reserve has now been extended to encompass the entire ranching area to form the 'Ol Pejeta Conservancy.' Approximately 90,000 acres in size. This has created the largest sanctuary in East Africa for the endangered Black Rhino. The aim of the conservancy is to generate profits from wildlife tourism for re-investing into community development in the local area. Porini Rhino Camp was selected as one of the camps to help in accomplishing these goals.

**O**ur Porini Camps are run and maintained with the conservation of the environment at the forefront. We have a written environmental policy in regards to water, land and energy , solid waste and sewage which is adhered to by the camp management . The number of tourists and visitors are being limited to retain the wild and unspoilt nature of the area and to minimize the impact on the environment.



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
